Choosing Text for the PSSA and Keystone Tests

PDE uses an approach that combines expert judgment, data, readability measures, and publication target audiences to define appropriate passages for the tests at each grade level. PDE uses numerous methods to calculate readability levels including Flesch, Dale-Chall, Lexile, Fry, Spache, and Text Complexity Analysis. All passages are reviewed again for any possible bias, fairness, and sensitivity issues. The litmus test for the appropriateness of a passage at a given grade level is its review by Pennsylvania educator committees who have grade level experience. The committee members must approve each passage used for a given grade level. Judgment by Pennsylvania classroom teachers with grade-level experience is the most important criterion during passage review.

Professional Learning

Close reading is not a new instructional practice, in fact, close reading has roots dating back to the 1920s. In the movement, New Criticism, close reading demanded a tight, clear, analytical reading of text. In the June and December eBLASTs, we discussed close reading and that teachers should purposefully select sections to reread that will lead students to gain a deeper understanding of the reading elements or structure they will need to analyze. The teacher should provide open-ended text dependent questions to promote discussion and to help students gain a better understanding of the nuances of the text.
