Text Dependent Analysis - Close Reading Lessons

The Text Dependent Analysis (TDA) close reading lessons are designed to be an example pathway for teaching comprehension and analysis of the reading

elements characterization and plot events.

The Instructional Plan guides teachers through the planning and teaching of each lesson, as well as modeling the response to a TDA prompt. The following instructional pathway focuses on the text The

The lessons are only one possible instructional pathway and teachers should feel free to modify them to meet the sequence of their curriculum, accommodate content previously taught, or to meet their current students' needs.
